

**Mentone Flying Club
August 2006 Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by the club vice president, Trent Powell. After the Pledge to the United States Flag, Dan Funk, Secretary, reviewed the minutes from the July meeting. Meeting minutes from previous meeting were approved. Bill Willard reported that the club's finances were in good standing. Our aircraft flew a total of 123 hours during the previous month. N4269T is in great shape. After discussion about the trim motor it was decided to have Dan Funk look into the price of a refurbished motor. N12874 has a new door handle after it was reported that it slipped occasionally. N4378Q has a series of radio problems that will be scheduled and fixed by Muncie Aviation (these have been fixed at the time of writing these minutes; the aircraft is good to go with no reported squawks).

Phil Hurst was voted in as an owner member and has been checked out by a club instructor. Stan Lozier was voted in as a social member and has already had his first airplane ride.

The club's logo will be considered for updating by the logo committee; they will be voting on ideas and will report at the next meeting.

Lou Sanchez is an air traffic controller from Grissom's approach control facility. Lou told us about a civilian fly-in being put together by a group of tanker pilots. He encourages us to attend. Pilots flying in will have the opportunity to land on the largest runway in Indiana and enjoy presentations and a lunch at the base. Lou continues to be a great friend to the club and extended an invitation to use the Grissom facility for flight following or anything else that they can do to help pilots flying in Grissom's airspace. After the meeting several people signed up to fly down to the event. At present time there are 11 people signed up, if we run out of seats, a group will drive down or rent additional airplanes.
